American Indian Wars – The Cheyenne Story

This fascinating course tells the story of the American Indian Wars from the perspective of one people, the Cheyenne, one of the most famous of the buffalo-hunting tribes of the Great Plains. They fought hard to protect their land from American settlement in the 19th century, forming an alliance with Sitting Bull's Sioux. They tasted victory in the summer of 1876, only to be defeated and forced on to appalling reservations hundreds of miles from their ancestral lands. Starving and ill, during the winter of 1878-79 they broke out of their prisons and tried to walk home, only to be attacked and massacred by American troops. Today, they have returned to the Great Plains, but the emotional scars of the 19th century have cast long shadows. We examine one tribe's experiences of war, economic collapse, imprisonment, massacre and regeneration set against the wider story of the huge Indian Wars that raged across the American West during the 19th Century as the US transformed the land and its people forever.

Dr. Mark Felton is a writer, historian and lecturer and the author of over 20 books, including the bestsellers 'Zero Night' and 'Castle of the Eagles', both currently being made into Hollywood films. He was an expat in China for a decade and now lives in Norwich.

Charles Rennie Mackintosh

Mackintosh lived in Chelsea from 1914 -1923. The only realised commission was the remodelling of 78 Derngate for model maker, W.J. Bassett-Lowke. CRM's early work in Scotland is considered as well as his pre-London time spent at Walberswick and his later years from 1923 in Port-Vendres. The Chelsea Years considers in more detail both CRM's work in London and those of friends such as Scottish colourist J.D. Fergusson and continues with an overview of the wider architectural and art world in Europe including German architect, Peter Behrens (who had a commission for Bassett-Lowke in 1926), and the Bauhaus group.

Rob Kendall MA is a Trustee and Chair of the Friends of 78 Derngate since 1998, and has developed a detailed interest in this period of the Scottish architect's life and work. He has delivered a number of talks about the restoration of 78 Derngate while at the same time developing an overview of the work of Mackintosh as well as W.J. Bassett-Lowke. He has established connections with the Hunterian Museum, Glasgow, which holds the main Mackintosh archive, and the Charles Rennie Mackintosh Society, having an interest in the Art Nouveau/ Art Deco architectural movement too.

The Typewriter: Tales that Turn Back Time

The new term Type Writer was used to describe the operator as well as the machine: early women pioneers becoming known as 'Lady Type Writers'. On this, the 150th anniversary of its invention, we will see how this one object not only revolutionised the Dickensian Counting House but opened-up new pathways for those whose opportunities for 'respectable' employment were few. Tracing its journey from its treadle-powered beginnings, from the manual to the digital age, we explore the interplay of the typewriter with the 19th century communications revolution, changes in work practices, ideas of class and gender and the unparalleled changes of the 20th century.

Sue Lomax PhD studied social history at the University of Essex, publishing on the Social History of the Department Store. Since 2005 she has taught across Essex, Suffolk and Norfolk, delivering courses for the WEA on British Urban History, Shops and Shopping, Women and the 20th Century and the History of Teaching, Shop and Office work.
